Pattern: Created in class in IQ Designer

NOTE: You must have a Babylock embroidery machine (Destiny 2, Destiny with both

upgrades, Altair, Meridian, or Solaris) in order to complete this project.

Project description: Create a festive holiday table runner while exploring the features in IQ Designer.

Fabric requirements:

1 yard background fabric

½ yard sashing fabric

 $\frac{1}{4}$ yard stocking fabric and filler block (a solid or fabric that reads as a solid is preferred) - filler block will have quilting

 $1\frac{1}{2}$ yards backing fabric (also used for several filler blocks)

1/3 yard binding fabric

Batting or $1\frac{1}{2}$ yards battilizer

2-3 yards SF 101 - all blocks will be stabilized

Notions:

This is your chance to be creative; have fun with Kimberbell glitter vinyl, polka dot vinyl, Kimberbell leather, mylar combined with tulle or any other embellishment you desire - you will need the following

2/3 yard twine, thin cording or 1/8" ribbon for light bulbs wire

- (3) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " pieces of fabric or glitter vinyl for bulbs
- (1) $2'' \times 4''$ piece of fabric or glitter vinyl or leather
- (1) 6" square fabric or glitter vinyl or mylar AND tulle for small ornament
- (1) 3" square fabric or glitter vinyl for small flower
- (1) 4" x 6" piece of felt, fabric, or cuddle for stocking top
- (1)7" X 10" piece of heat and bond to fuse to back of stocking fabric

Glue pen or glue with a fine tip - you will glue down your twine or ribbon for the string of lights

Embroidery thread and pre-wound bobbins or empty bobbins; sample uses three shades of gray, red, two shades of green, and white - threads will either contrast or match your fabric choices

- Please bring your machine stylus
- A wired mouse for Solaris/Solaris 2 owners will make your life so much easier!!! A wired mouse can be used with any of the machines but is essential in place of the soft-tipped stylus provided with the Solaris in fine-tuning your creation!

Other optional items:

Small Iron and ironing mat to use at your table **optional** but helpful for fusing the glitter vinyl in place

Rotary, cutter, ruler & mat for trimming blocks

505 Spray adhesive or safety pins to hold three layers for quilting

USB stick for saving designs

No show mesh stabilizer – there will be five hoopings using the larger hoops 1 PIECE OF TOPPER IF USING MINKIE OR CUDDLE FABRIC

Supplies:

Babylock embroidery machine with IQ Designer

Embroidery arm, embroidery foot, power cord, and your largest hoops - bring two or three of the largest size

IQ Scan tablet or your phone – if your machine does not have a scan tablet Sewing machine accessories (if we get that far) including $\frac{1}{4}$ " foot and foot pedal Pins and seam ripper

Applique scissors and thread snips

Due to COVID19 restrictions, the class is limited to 12 participants, each utilizing their own table. Masks must be worn at all times in class; food is not permitted in the classroom. Since this is an all day class, we will break for lunch. You may sew during this time, eat outside or in your car, or pick up lunch; no instruction will take place during this time.

Please make sure you bring everything as the store does not have an excess inventory of machine accessories. Also, as the store has a five person guest limit, you will have to wait in line if you need to purchase a forgotten item.

Please read the "PRIOR TO CLASS" items and come prepared. We will be working at a fast pace. If you have to cut and prepare your fabric, you will waste a lot of your class time. If you have any questions, please stop in or call the shop and we will be happy to assist you.

Prior to class:

From the background fabric CUT AND INTERFACE as follows:

- 18" X WOF
 - Subcut 15" x 18" for stocking
 - Subcut 15" x 18" for lights
 - Subcut 10" x 18" for long ornament
- 12" x WOF
 - o 12" x 12" for large ornament
 - \circ 10" x 12" for small ornament

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From the sashing fabric, CUT AND INTERFACE:

- 5" X WOF
 - Subcut (3) 1 ½" X WOF
 - O Subcut $1\frac{1}{2}$ " strips into the following:
 - 1 ½" ×13 ½"
 - $1\frac{1}{2}$ " × 12 1/2 "
 - (3) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ "
 - $1\frac{1}{2}$ " × $16\frac{1}{2}$ "

 - 1/1/2" X 7"

From the stocking fabric

- CUT AND INTERFACE $5\frac{1}{4}$ " x 12" piece for large filler block
- CUT and apply HEAT AND BOND or other 2 sided fusible product to $7" \times 10"$ piece of fabric

From the backing fabric:

Cut the backing fabric in half along folded edge resulting in (1) 22" by 54" piece that will be used for the backing

From the remaining lengthwise piece CUT AND INTERFACE

- Cut (2) 3" x 13 $\frac{1}{2}$ " pieces
- Cut (2) 2" x 4 1/2" pieces
- Cut (1) 4" x 7" piece
- From the binding fabric cut (4) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ X WOF
