

OVERSIZED REVERSABLE KIMONO JACKET WORKSHOP

Instructor: Libby Daugherty

Dates: Thursday, April 25, 10 a.m. to 5 p.m.

Techniques: Straight seams, facing, pockets, sleeves, edge stitching, and hemming

Please purchase your supplies BEFORE the day of class. QB staff will help you!

Pattern is Required for this class:
Making No. 4/Lines, pages 47-55.

Fabric and Yardages: (Please do not choose a plaid or directional fabric.)
Choose light to medium-weight woven, such as textured cotton, chambray, linen, soft denim, and cotton/linen blends. I used Essex—a cotton/linen blend and cotton for my lining.

3 yards main fabric and 3 yards lining (45-inch wide fabric); 2 1/2 yards of main and lining (54-inch wide fabric); 1 1/4 light-weight fusible interfacing

Tools and Sewing Notions:

1. Sewing machine with table, tools, feet, power cord, and foot pedal
2. General sewing foot and Edge-stitching foot
3. 5" Scissors
4. Wonder Clips and Pins
5. NEW 12/80 needle in your machine
6. Thread to match your fabric (Aurifill or Mettler)
7. Seam ripper
8. Frixion Pen
9. Six-inch stitch gauge (Dritz)
10. Iron and pressing surface
11. Pressing cloth
12. Precision Point Turner
13. Bring your leftover fabric from cutting your Kimono.

Quilt Beginnings

Preparation before the first Class

1. Gather supplies and tools BEFORE the day of class. QB staff will help you.
2. Wash your fabrics as you plan to wash after your garment is made. (Preshrink)
3. Iron your fabric. (Best Press works great.)
4. Prepare your pattern. The pattern is available as a free PDF download at makingzine.com/pages/downloads. Be sure you print the pattern at 100% on letter paper. Do not scale to fit the page. Before cutting, measure the 1 x 1-inch test square on Page A to make sure the pattern pieces have printed at the correct size. Cut the excess paper off around the borders and tape the pages together, lining up the edges according to the diagram included in the PDF.
5. Cut out jacket fabric. Pay attention to the grainlines and transfer all markings to your fabrics.
6. Read through the instructions before class to familiarize yourself with the steps.
7. Bring snacks, lunch, and drink with lid.
