## Scalloped Borders & Binding

### Supply List

**Instructor:** Cathy Daum

**Project description:** Learn how easy it is to calculate a scallop border using simple math and the Easy Scallop Tool. We will create a single fold bias binding and learn to attach it for perfect corners and smooth edges. You will be ready to apply your binding at home.

**Required: Easy Scallop Tool**

#### **Fabric requirements:**

Bring a finished quilt you would like to add a scalloped binding to

-OR-

Pick a panel (at least 22" x 36" ) that you'd like to finish into a small quilt, put a 4-6" border around it and quilt it. It should be ready for binding.

-OR-

1 yard of Muslin

Fat Quarter for binding

36" x 22" piece of low loft batting (craft size will work)

#### **Sewing supplies:**

1. Rotary cutter, 18" ruler and mat
2. Sewing machine and accessories (1/4" foot is very helpful)
3. Neutral thread, scissors to clip threads

#### **Prior to Class:**

If you are making a muslin sample, do the following (otherwise just bring your quilt that is ready for binding along with you)

Cut the Muslin in half lengthwise to yield two pieces 22" x 36"

(or cut your backing to fit your panel, if you chose that option)

Spray baste the batting between the two layers of fabric.

Stitch through the layers across the diagonals to keep them snugly together.

This will create your little quilt that you can attach a scallop binding to.

We will cut the bias strips and make the bias binding in class.
